<p style="text-align: center;">*Visitors who have completed full series of vaccine dose(s)</p> <p>In-room visitation may be arranged with the following considerations:</p> <p>All visitors are screened with the following considerations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No signs or symptoms of COVID-19 (e.g. temp, cough, etc.) • Produce written confirmation the vaccine was received; • Hand hygiene upon arrival, departure and as needed during visit • Proper use of surgical face mask (covering mouth and nose) • Adhere to limited number of visitors per resident at one time. Maximum visitors per visit is 2. One at a time is recommended. • Limit the movement in the community. For example, visitors should not walk around different halls of the community. Rather, they should go directly to the resident's room or designated visitation area. 	<p style="text-align: center;">*Visitors who have not completed full series of vaccine dose(s) who provide proof of a <u>Negative COVID-19 test</u> within the previous (7 days) to the community.</p> <p>In-room visitation may be arranged with the following considerations.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Indoor visitation for unvaccinated residents should be limited solely to compassionate care situations if the COVID-19 county positivity rate is >10% and <70% of residents in the community are fully vaccinated. • All visitors are screened with the following considerations: No signs or symptoms of COVID-19 (e.g. temp, cough, etc.) • Hand hygiene upon arrival, departure and as needed during visit • Proper use of surgical face mask (covering mouth and nose) • Adhere to limited number of visitors per resident at one time. Maximum visitors per visit is 2. One at a time is recommended. • Limit the movement in the community. For example, visitors should not walk around different halls of the community. Rather, they should go directly to the resident's room or designated visitation area. 	<p style="text-align: center;">*Visitors who have not completed full series of vaccine dose(s) or provided proof of negative COVID-19 test within the previous 7 days.</p> <p>Visitors who are unable to participate in the COVID infection prevention protocol should not be permitted to participate in 'In-room' visitations. For visitors not able to participate in the previously stated considerations, please take part in our outdoor visits or the Century Park connection room.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>(See Century Connection Room Protocol)</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Please consider these 3 options for Compassionate Care Visits</p> <p>While end-of-life situations have been used as examples of compassionate care situations, the term "compassionate care situations" does not exclusively refer to end-of-life situations. Examples of other types of compassionate care situations include, but are not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A resident, who was living with their family before recently being admitted to a nursing home, is struggling with the change in environment and lack of physical family support. • A resident who is grieving after a friend or family member recently passed away. • A resident who needs cueing and encouragement with eating or drinking, previously provided by family and/or caregiver(s), is experiencing weight loss or dehydration. • A resident, who used to talk and interact with others, is experiencing emotional distress, seldom speaking, or crying more frequently (when the resident had rarely cried in the past).
